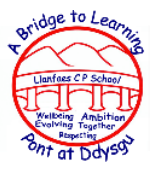

However, through our termly attendance data, we have identified a number of pupils whose attendance is beginning to fall into the persistent absence category. This can be due to a range of factors, including late arrival after the register has been taken, absences without a reported reason, holidays taken during term time, and medical needs. We understand that some circumstances are unavoidable, and we are here to support families wherever possible. Regular attendance is vital for children's learning and wellbeing, so we kindly ask for your continued support in trying to ensure your child attends school every day they are able.
